Greetings from The Nippon Foundation, and Happy Valentine's Day. A unique Valentine's Day culture has evolved in Japan since the holiday was first introduced to the country by a confectioner in the 1930s. The first difference is that Valentine's Day is associated with chocolate, and the gifts given are primarily chocolates made specifically for the holiday. Although customs continue to evolve, it is traditionally women who give gifts of Valentine's Day chocolates to men on February 14. The gifts are broadly classified into two main types – *giri choco* (obligatory chocolate) for workplace colleagues and casual friends, and *honmei choco* (true feelings chocolate) for a romantic partner or man for whom the woman has romantic feelings. Men then give women gifts in return on March 14, which is known as White Day. Department stores have extra sales areas set up and confectionary shops sell special products for both Valentine's Day and White Day, doing a bustling business on the days leading up to February 14 and March 14.

## Launch of Research into Deep-Sea 'Dark Oxygen'

Supporting Scottish Association for Marine Science's work to discover new mechanism for creating oxygen



The Nippon Foundation and the Scottish Association for Marine Science (SAMS) held a joint press event on January 17 at Scotland House London to announce their launch of research into "dark oxygen," a mysterious form of oxygen created in the ocean depths by a mechanism other than photosynthesis. The research will involve surveying 11,000 meters below the ocean surface using newly developed, specialized experimental equipment, and has been endorsed as a United Nations Ocean Decade activity.
