Our Journey of International Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Support

The Nippon Foundation has donated more than 5 billion yen to 18 organizations in 13 countries for over 30 years. The support range widely from leadership training, raising social awareness about sign languages, improving access to elementary to high school, to establishing bases for career support.

- 1992 Scholarship support for DHH students launched (Gallaudet, National Technical Institute for the Deaf)
- 2000 International educational network support for the DHH launched
- 2002 Bilingual Deaf Education support in Vietnam launched
- 2003 Sign language promotion efforts in Asia-Pacific launched
- 2016 Bilingual Deaf Education support expands to the Philippines
- 2018 Bilingual Deaf Education support expands to Laos
- 2021 Career support for the DHH launched (the Philippines, Vietnam)

Seamless Support for the Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing (DHH) from Education to Employment

More than 200 million DHH people in Asia. The problem at hand is many of them do not get the chance to acquire accessible language. The Nippon Foundation supports acquisition of sign language to broaden their horizons.



Schools where students learn through sign language (Bilingual Deaf Education)

We have supported the growth of Bilingual Deaf Education in 3 countries using local sign and written languages.



Raising social awareness about sign languages

We have promoted recognition of sign languages as equal as spoken languages. To foster sign language-friendly societies, we have supported training of linguists and creation of dictionaries and teaching materials in sign languages. Our "Shuwa Town" uses AI to allow anyone to easily start learning sign language.



Specialized employment support for DHH people

Our base at the renowned De La Salle University in the Philippines is expanding employment options through career support and improving workplace environments.



Undergraduate and graduate scholarships for future leaders

We support students from developing countries studying abroad at well-known universities for the DHH such as Gallaudet University and National Technical Institute for the Deaf (Rochester Institute of Technology).

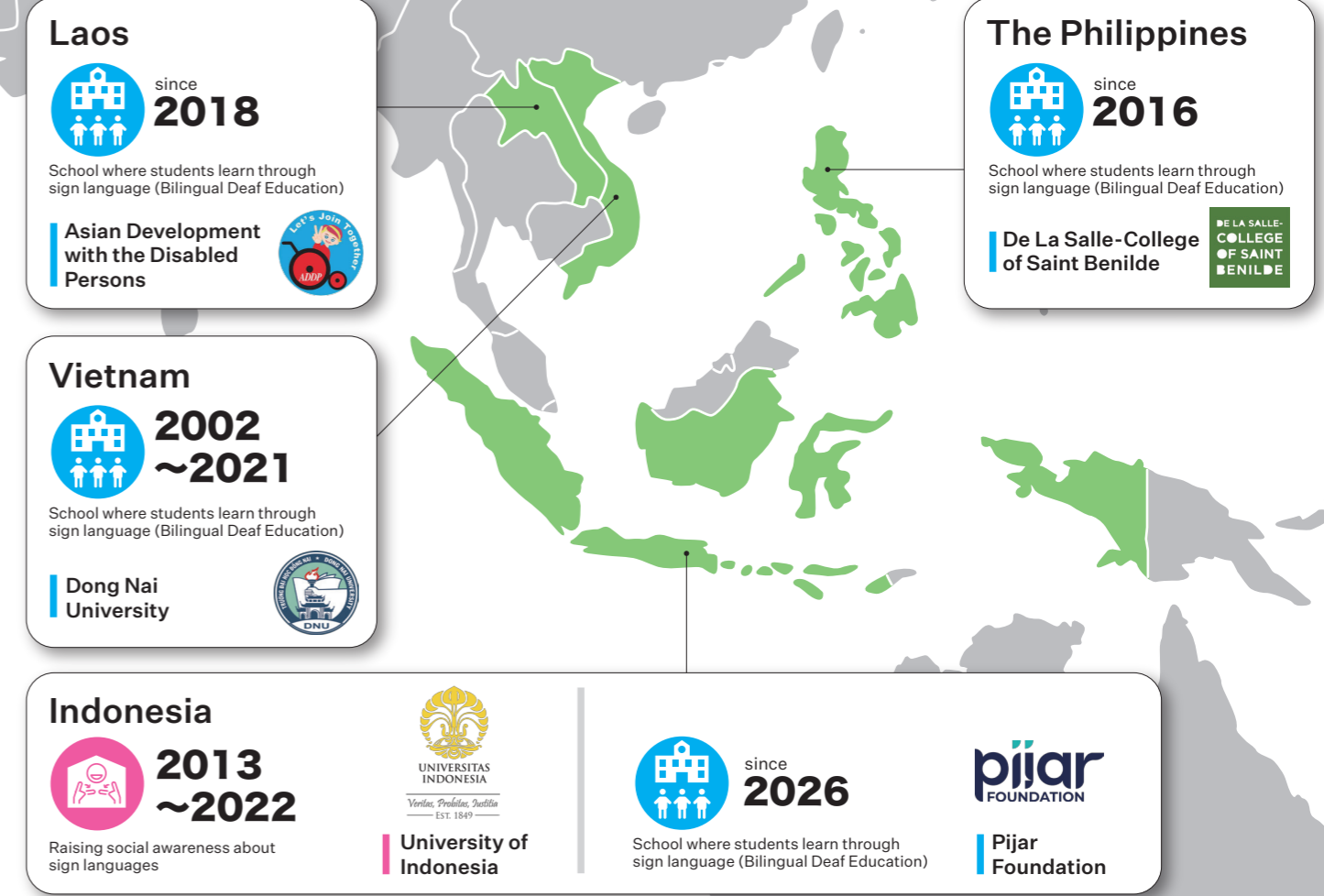
